

## THE JOHNS HOPKINS UNIVERSITY VICE PROVOST FOR ADMISSIONS AND FINANCIAL AID

The Johns Hopkins University announces its search for an inaugural vice provost for admissions and financial aid. This is a new position, reflecting Johns Hopkins' deep commitment to the undergraduate experience. Reporting to the provost and serving as a member of the provost's leadership team, the vice provost is responsible for all aspects of the undergraduate recruitment, admissions and financial aid processes for Hopkins' two undergraduate schools, the Krieger School of Arts and Sciences and the Whiting School of Engineering. The new vice provost will serve in close collaboration with the president, the provost, deans, vice provost for student affairs, faculty, and other senior leaders to attract and enroll students of the highest academic quality.

The vice provost for admissions and financial aid will sustain and improve upon the university's recent admissions trajectory, with the mandate to seek continuous improvements in all facets of admissions and financial aid. In particular, President Ron Daniels has set a goal of achieving a sustained need blind admissions process that underscores the university's strong commitment to access and diversity. The vice provost will play a critical leadership role in planning for and achieving this status—working closely with senior leadership to develop competitive packaging strategies.

The new vice provost will be a seasoned professional who will bring exceptional strategic, quantitative and analytic skills, with a demonstrated record of successfully leading an admissions and/or financial aid office. S/he should bring vision, optimism, constant communication, and energy to the overall strategic positioning of the university, leading the university in best navigating the increasingly competitive higher education student marketplace.
